

MODERATED KEYNOTE INTERVIEW

Aeropolitical facts: Two months after the Trump administration has arrived in office

Moderator Marcel Riwalsky, CEO of Aviation-Event, conducted a keynote interview with Candace McGraw, Chair of the ACI World Governing Board and CEO of Cincinnati/Northern Kentucky International Airport. Their discussion highlighted key aeropolitical developments two months into the second term of the Trump administration. Addressing a topic of global interest, they explored the impact of the administration's policies on both the United States and the world, particularly in light of the uncertainty and turbulence surrounding its early months. Shifting the focus to aviation, Marcel Riwalsky invited Candace McGraw to share her perspective on the future of American aviation. She acknowledged that changes in administration inevitably bring a degree of uncertainty but expressed optimism that the appointment of key officials and a renewed leadership team in the aviation sector could restore much-needed stability. Candace McGraw also highlighted developments at Cincinnati/Northern Kentucky International Airport, discussing its airline network, digitalization efforts aimed at enhancing the passenger experience, and its strategic geographical location. She emphasized how the airport's position enables a broad catchment area, contributing to its status as the world's second-largest DHL hub. She noted that the expansion of its cargo operations has been a key factor in distinguishing the airport from others. Finally, speaking in her capacity of Chair of ACI World, Candace McGraw underscored the organization's strategic role in driving global aviation development and growth.

MODERATED KEYNOTE INTERVIEW

Enhancing Operational Excellence Through Digital Integration



Frédéric Chevalier, Deputy Chief Executive Officer, Lagardère Travel Retail

Moderator Miquel Ross, Aviation Journalist for AeroTime, and Frédéric Chevalier, Deputy Chief Executive Officer, Lagardère Travel Retail, engaged in a keynote interview centered on the evolving role of airport retail and the impact of digital integration on operational excellence.

The discussion began with an overview of Lagardère's extensive global network, as Miquel Ross and Frédéric Chevalier examined the vital connection between airport retail, economic growth, and regional development. They emphasized how well-integrated commercial strategies contribute to the dynamic evolution of both airports and the areas they serve.

Frédéric Chevalier highlighted the necessity of tailoring commercial offerings to match the nature of airport traffic and passenger demographics. He stressed the importance of customer-centric strategies, ensuring that retail offerings align with travelers' needs and preferences.

The conversation then shifted to digitalization, with a focus on how innovation should serve to streamline operations rather than introduce unnecessary complexities. Frédéric Chevalier underscored that digital tools should enhance efficiency and contribute to a seamless passenger journey, avoiding unnecessary "digital gimmicks."

They further explored how digitalization creates a competitive advantage in airport retail by improving the overall travel experience, reducing stress, and enhancing convenience. Ultimately, they concluded that smooth, efficient retail operations not only drive business growth and sales but also play a key role in attracting and retaining passengers—reinforcing the cycle of airport expansion and development.

PANEL 1 Europe on its own? Major aviation players leaving the path of liberalization and decarbonization?

Moderated by Luc Citrinot, Journalist at Voyages d'Affaires Paris, the panel featured Luis Felipe de Oliveira, former Director General of ACI World, Rüdiger Franke, CEO of Hahn Airport and Askin Demir, CEO of LAS LIMAK AIBD SUMMA SA (Aéroport International Blaise Diagne). Together, they engaged in a thought-provoking discussion on the future of European aviation, addressing key concerns about the region's trajectory amid shifting industry dynamics. The conversation explored the potential threats to Europe's aviation market, particularly in light of major players moving away from liberalization and decarbonization efforts. The moderator set the stage by outlining Europe's geopolitical significance in the global aviation sector, presenting data that sparked an engaging debate among the panellists.

Discussions delved into the European domestic market and its vulnerabilities, with the panelists assessing the impact of the current economic and socio-political landscape on aviation growth. As the global aviation center of gravity shifts toward the Asia-Pacific region, they emphasized the need for Europe to adapt its strategies to maintain competitiveness and avoid stalling the sector's development.

On the topic of decarbonization, the panel examined whether Europe's ambitious sustainability goals are economically viable in an international landscape where it appears to be leading the charge alone. While recognizing that passengers ultimately decide their preferred modes of transportation, the panelists agreed on the importance of prioritizing connectivity and offering efficient, sustainable travel options. They stressed that ensuring a seamless and environmentally responsible journey is crucial for advancing long-term decarbonization efforts.

PANEL 2 | Shaping the Future of Aviation: is the aviation industry open for new technology? If so: open only for tech giants or startup players as well?

Moderated by Christoph Martin Madsen, Founder of BongoPlanes, the panel explored the role of innovation in shaping the future of aviation. Panelists Clara Sasse, Co-CEO, Sasse Group, Florian Kruse, CEO, Evia Aero, Dieter Klawunder, CEO, ModiVision, Gert Taeymans, EVP Europe, ADB SAFEGATE, and Antoine Rostworowski, Senior VP, ACI World discussed the industry's openness to new technology—whether it primarily benefits tech giants or also extends to startups. The session began with introductions, leading into a conversation on emerging technologies, with panelists agreeing that optimizing existing infrastructure through innovation is crucial to managing rising passenger traffic. They highlighted the growing influence of startups and innovation hubs in driving creative yet reliable solutions to enhance the passenger experience.

A key focus of the discussion was the regulatory landscape and whether it fosters or restricts technological progress. The panelists argued that regulations should evolve alongside technological advancements rather than act as barriers to innovation. They explored the impact of AI, biometrics, and automation on the aviation sector, emphasizing their potential to streamline operations and enhance efficiency. The need for a forward-thinking approach to technology adoption was underscored, ensuring that airports remain adaptable to the evolving demands of the industry.

The panel concluded with a shared perspective that airports are transforming into hubs of innovation, energy, and technology. To stay ahead, industry players must embrace continuous technological advancements while maintaining operational resilience. The consensus was clear: the future of aviation depends on a proactive approach to change, leveraging innovation to improve efficiency, sustainability, and the overall passenger journey.

Moderated by Michael Eggenschwiler Senior Aviation Executive and Aviation-Event Board Member, the panel brought together key industry figures, including Nicolae Stoica, General Director of the Romanian Civil Aeronautical Authority, Vasile Țocu, Director of Bucharest Air Navigation Services, Costin Iordache, CEO of TAROM, Antonio Stoian, CEO of Animawings, and Claudiu Marian, Director of the Department of Contemporary History and International Studies at Babes-Bolyai University. The discussion explored the crucial role of cooperation among regulatory bodies, airlines, and other aviation stakeholders in ensuring safety, while also addressing the economic impact of aviation as a key driver of employment, tourism, and business development.

Airlines, as major stakeholders, were highlighted as having a dual responsibility—not only to adhere to safety standards but also to enhance the passenger experience by providing seamless travel services. The discussion also touched upon the evolving nature of regulations, particularly in response to emerging technologies, ensuring that aviation safety standards remain robust in the face of innovation. The panel underscored the critical role of collaboration and communication among stakeholders in maintaining compliance and ensuring the smooth implementation of aviation safety standards. Concluding the discussion, the panelists reinforced the idea that a globally unified approach to aviation safety, supported by clear and efficient regulations, is essential for the continued advancement of the industry.
